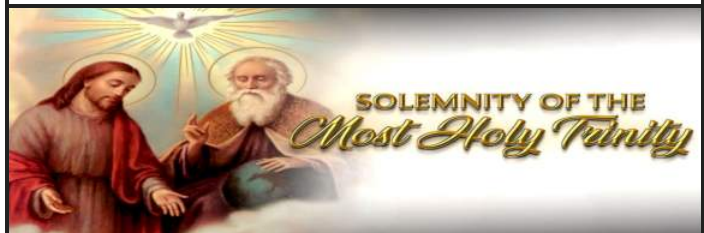

HOLY MATRIMONY

June is the start of wedding season!

The Catholic Church has a long history of helping couples to prepare for marriage. It has learned a great deal that can benefit any couple, regardless of religion. Because the Catholic Church wants couples to form strong, lasting marriages, couples who wish to marry in the Catholic Church are asked to:

- Contact and meet with your parish priest as soon as you are engaged.
- Take at least six months to intensively prepare for your marriage. This goes beyond choosing a date and church, reserving a place for the reception, and picking out dresses. It means using this time to delve more deeply into your relationship and approach this momentous day with prayer and reflection.
- Attend an approved marriage preparation program. There are many different formats for marriage preparation programs ranging from intensive weekends, to a weekly series to "in home" mentor couple programs. They are not restricted to Catholics, but they are always in keeping with Church teaching.
- Most dioceses ask couples to take marriage preparation inventory (such as FOCCUS, PMI, or PREPARE). These are not "tests" to determine whether you can get married in the Church, but rather discussion starters to assess what issues you already agree on and what you might need to discuss further. 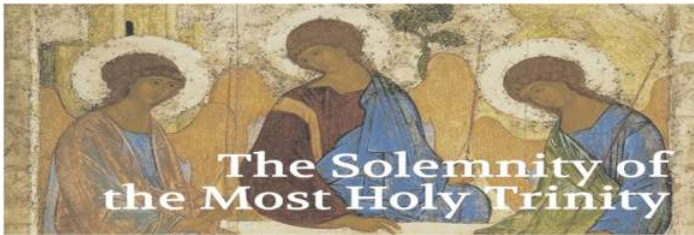

The Mystery of the Most Holy Trinity

“The Feast of the Most Holy Trinity leads us to contemplate the mystery of God who unceasingly creates, redeems and sanctifies, always with love and through love.” -Pope Francis, May 27, 2018

The mystery of the Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and life. God reveals himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The doctrine of the Trinity includes three truths of faith.

First, the Trinity is One. We do not speak of three gods but one God. Each of the Persons is fully God. They are a unity of Persons in one divine nature.

Second, the Divine Persons are distinct from each other. Father, Son, and Spirit are not three appearances or modes of God, but three identifiable persons, each fully God in a way distinct from the others.

Third, the Divine Persons are in relation to each other. The distinction of each is understood only in reference to the others. The Father cannot be the Father without the Son, nor can the Son be the Son without the Father. The Holy Spirit is related to the Father and the Son who both send him forth.

Prayer to the Most Holy Trinity

The three visionaries of Fatima saw the angel prostrate before a host and chalice that hung in the air. Worshipping the Eucharist, the angel prayed:

“Most Holy Trinity ~
 Father, Son, and Holy Spirit ~
 I offer you the most precious Body, Blood,
 Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ,
 present in all the tabernacles of the world,
 in reparation for the outrages,
 sacrileges, and indifference with which
 He Himself is offended.
 And, through the infinite merits of
 His Most Sacred Heart,
 and the Immaculate Heart of Mary,
 I beg of you the conversion of poor sinners.”
 Amen.

READING REFLECTIONS For The Most Holy Trinity

Reading I: Proverbs 8: 22-31

Wisdom, personified as a woman, tells us she was present with God before the creation of the world, yet she is distinct from Him. Divine wisdom is uncreated but exemplified in creation.

Reading II: Romans 5: 1-5

Those persons who are justified are endowed with faith, whereby they have access to God's grace. They also have hope of future glory and true charity, by which they show the love of the Holy Spirit dwelling in them.

The Gospel: John 16: 12-15

The Holy Spirit will lead believers to the fullness of the truth of the Gospel. He also gives us a share in the divine life and the authority of Christ.



Saint Juliana of Falconieri
 1279 ~ 1341
 Feast Day ~ June 19

Juliana was the only child of a wealthy couple in Florence, Italy, who had built the church of the Annunciation there. She refused to marry and was enrolled as a tertiary with the Servite Order; her uncle, St. Alexis Falconieri, was one of the seven founders of the Servites. For nearly 20 years, Juliana lived a devout and useful life at home. In 1304 she formed a community of tertiary sisters who devoted themselves to prayer and good works in Florence. She is considered the foundress of the Servite community of nuns, and was canonized in 1737.



The Blessed Trinity

Today we celebrate the feast day of the Blessed Trinity. The word Trinity is a title for God that tells us that He is three Persons in one God.

Before Jesus came, the people didn't know that God was a Trinity. The Israelites knew that there was only one God, but they didn't know very much about Him. Jesus showed the people that there were three Persons in God when He taught them about Himself and the Father and the Holy Spirit.

The three Persons in the Blessed Trinity are all equal but different. We cannot understand this, but we believe it because Jesus taught it. It is one of the Mysteries of our Faith.

What does the Holy Trinity do for us? We know that God the Father made everything and we are intended to go back to Him. The Holy Spirit guides us towards Him, and Jesus is the way.

Every time you make the Sign of the Cross or say the "Glory Be" you are praying to the Blessed Trinity.

DERBY SCHOOL SHOWCASES COUNTRIES AROUND THE WORLD

Students from St. Mary-St. Michael School in Derby took part in a first-time, hands-on "Around the World" project to learn more about different countries.

Each grade chose a country and learned about its geography, history, holidays, traditions, food, fashion, landmarks, language, sports, music, religion and so much more.

"Everybody did something different," says Toni Ann LaMattina, principal of St. Mary-St. Michael School. "I gave them free rein."

Some of the featured countries included Germany, Guatemala, Italy, Japan and Poland.

"This was an opportunity for the students to show off their work," LaMattina says. "We never had a themed activity. This was a new thing."

To showcase their country, each classroom wrote reports, decorated bulletin boards, created flags and gave presentations during an evening open house. A few multicultural dishes were prepared for guests to enjoy.

"In my first year as principal, it was so amazing to see the students show off their hard work that they completed in class," LaMattina says.

"They were smiling from ear to ear, showing their parents and they were so welcoming to the new families that came in for a tour of our school."

The eighth grade class focused on Italy. One student studied a particular city in the country. "I learned a lot about the history of Basilicata, Italy," says student Shenaye. "It is very historical. I feel history builds our future."

Guatemala was the class project selected by sixth graders. The students focused on the significance of the country, its geography, renowned landmarks and the country's flag.

The three-panel, vertical flag is adorned by blue stripes on the left and right sides, which represent the Atlantic and Pacific oceans. The white stripe in the center represents peace and highlights the coat of arms shield of Guatemala, adopted after the 1871 Liberal Revolution.

Zarah says she enjoyed writing about Guatemala's flag. "I learned about the stripes," she says.

Fourth graders chose Germany for their country. Matias wrote about the history of the Berlin Wall. "I chose the Berlin Wall because back then, Germany was divided and East Germany built it to stop the people crossing the border,"

Around the World culminated with an evening open house. Parents, guests and new families to the school were invited to see the work by the students.

"The event was a great success," LaMattina says. "We had many school families along with a handful of new families. I received much positive feedback from this event, and I plan to continue with it each year and change up the theme."

The day after the open house, the principal recalls students asking her if they can do the project again next year "which showed that it was all worth it."

The teachers enjoyed Around the World too, LaMattina says. "Not only did the students enjoy this project, but the teachers did as well."

he wrote in an essay. "Today, you can still go there. Now it's possible to pass the city with no worries."

For Delia, she says learning some German words was a lot of fun. She adds she was surprised that hamburgers and pretzels are popular foods among German residents.

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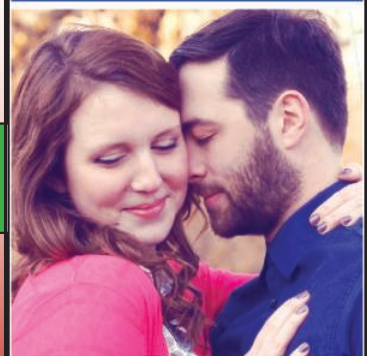
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
